

THE LAW OF FALLING BODIES tells the story of Virgil Foggy, a farm boy who is doing his best to survive on a failing dairy farm in Minnesota. Virgil fights to keep the farm from going under in the wake of his father's death and after his grandfather's stroke, while contending with an abusive stepfather (his dead father's brother) who wants to sell the farm. In each chapter, Virgil receives a letter from his brother, a soldier in Vietnam, which poignantly sets the era and international climate. A complicated relationship ensues between Virgil and his beautiful cousin Ginger, while numerous events conspire to take away his childhood and break his spirit. His resilience and even the resilience of the farm itself show us the human spirit struggling but refusing to go under. It's an absorbing battle. It's a story you'll never forget.
